


**Qwest® Advanced Networking Modem with Wireless:  
2Wire® 2700 HG**

**Web Remote Access  
How to Access Your Home Network**

You can access your Qwest® Advanced Networking Modem with Wireless: 2Wire® 2700 HG (also referred to as your wireless gateway) from a remote location using the Web Remote Access function.


You may use Remote Access to access your home network, from a remote location.

1. Open your browser and type your **personal domain name** into the address line (e.g., www.jonesfamily.accessmyhome.net).
  - When connecting to your home network using Web Remote Access, your browser may display a security alert.
  - After this alert displays, select **Yes** to proceed to the Remote Access Center.
2. Enter the Web Remote Access password you chose during application set up, in the **Password** field. Then, select **Submit**.
